Contrast Extravasation

How do I treat my extravasation site at home?

- 1. Apply ice to affected area for 20 minutes every hour for next 24 hours, while you are awake. Wrap ice in towel. Do not put ice directly on skin.
- 2. After first 24 hours, apply warm compresses for comfort.
- 3. Elevate extremity above heart as much as you can.

When to call your doctor or the radiology department:

Swelling or redness of the IV site can last for 1 to 2 days.

- 1. Numbness or tingling of lower arm or hand.
- 2. Blisters at the site.
- 3. Unusual coolness of lower arm or hand beyond injection site.
- 4. Increased pain.
