## **Contrast Extravasation Staging and Treatment**

**Warm pack:** Apply warm pack for one hour after treatment. **Cold pack:** Apply for 20 minutes, 4 times a day for 48 hours.

| Stage 1                | <ul> <li>Pain at site</li> <li>Difficulty with IV cannula flushes.</li> <li>No redness or swelling</li> </ul>  | <ol> <li>Remove IV cannula.</li> <li>Elevate extremity.</li> </ol>  |
| Stage 2                | <ul><li>Pain at site</li><li>Redness and slight swelling at site.</li><li>Brisk capillary refill.</li></ul>  | <ol> <li>Remove IV cannula.</li> <li>Elevate extremity.</li> </ol>  |
| Stage 3                | <ul> <li>Pain at site</li> <li>Moderate swelling.</li> <li>Blanching of area</li> <li>Skin cool to touch</li> <li>Brisk capillary refill below the site.</li> </ul>  | <ol> <li>Leave IV cannula in place, and, using a</li> <li>1ml syringe, aspirate as much fluid as possible.</li> <li>Remove cannula after aspiration attempt.</li> <li>Elevate extremity.</li> <li>Consider antidote.</li> </ol> |
| Stage 4                | <ul> <li>Pain</li> <li>Severe swelling around site.</li> <li>Blanching of area</li> <li>Skin cool to touch</li> <li>Area of skin necrosis or blistering.</li> <li>Prolonged capillary refill time (&lt;4 seconds)</li> <li>Decreased or absent pulse.</li> </ul> | <ol> <li>Leave IV cannula in place, and, using a 1ml syringe, aspirate as much fluid as possible.</li> <li>Remove cannula after aspiration attempt.</li> <li>Elevate extremity.</li> <li>Surgical consultation.</li> </ol>      |
